PASSAGE 1

Each day every person throws away more than five pounds of garbage. There is more refuse now than ever before and most of <u>it</u> is made up of the packages and cans in which we buy our food. The traditional way of getting rid of solid waste-the open dump-is quickly becoming <u>inadequate</u>. Many cities are experimenting with newer ways of handling their growing piles of garbage.



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One of these new ways is "recycling". Through recycling, usable materials are taken out of trash and made into something else. These usable parts of trash are put through the cycle of going from a raw material to a finished product again.

In some cities, a machine called "Hydrapulper" is being used to help recycle garbage. A Hydrapulper is like a huge mixing machine. The garbage is dumped onto a conveyor belt that feeds the machine. At the same time, water is pumped into the Hydrapulper. (The machine got its name from hydra, which means "water".) With a swirling and mixing action, the Hydrapulper throws out the heavy metal objects that can later be sold as scrap metal. The rest of the rubbish – paper, food, plastic, rubber, glass, wood, and other items- disintegrates, or falls apart. The rubbish is then mixed with water and carried in slush to another piece of equipment where glass, sand, and small pieces of metal are spun out.

At the end of the process, combustible organic materials are separated out and put into another vessel. Here they are oxidized as they hit against grains of hot sand being blown around at high speed in the vessel. With the Hydrapulper, up to 95 percent of the original garbage is reclaimed, or oxidized. The oxidized material is incinerator ash.

The population of the world has increased more in modern times than in all other ages of history combined. The world population totaled about 500 million in 1650. It doubled in the period from 1650-1850. Today, the population is more than five billion. Estimates based on research by the United Nations indicate that it will be more than double in the twenty-five years between 1975 and the year 2000, reaching seven billion by the turn of the century.

No one knows the limits of population that the earth can support. Thomas Malthus, an English economist, developed a theory that became widely accepted in the nineteenth century. What science fiction once told of other worlds far far away, is now a fact. Astronomers have found another solar system like ours. The solar system was found in the group of stars called Andromeda. Geoffrey Marcy, the man who found the solar system says, "What we have found now, for the first time ever, is indeed a fullfledged system of planets around the star Upsilon Andromeda. It appears to have three planets, one close in, one at a middle distance, and one farther out. When I look up at the stars now at night, I can imagine easily that every one of them has planets around them." The star is slightly larger than our Sun. The planets are huge, like our Jupiter.

Deborah Fischer, his associate, described the solar system, "Here's the inner planet that goes around every 4.6 days, the middle planet that goes around every 242 days, and then the outer planet that goes around every three and a half to four years."

It was a wobble in the star that led Marcy to the planets. "The star wobbles around due to the gravity of the planet much like a dog owner gets yanked around by a little poodle."

Can they support life? We don't know. That, Marcy says, is astronomy's next challenge.


